What is HUDUMA NAMBA?

The Huduma Namba exercise is being conducted by the National Integrated Identity Management system (NIIMS). The nationwide mass bio-metric registration programme was launched on 2nd April by President Uhuru Kenyatta and runs for 45 days **DEADLINE being 18th May, 2019.**

The process involves collection of biometric data resulting to generation of a unique number. The number will enable the holder to access government services including applying for an Alien Card, Work permit documentation, driving license, ID, birth certificate etc.

Required Documents

- Alien Card
- Kenya Revenue Authority PIN
- NSSF number
- NHIF
- Work permit details
- Child birth certificate
- Passport
- Digital picture (taken on site)

Information to be filled in the registration forms

- Nationality (Citizen, non-national or dual citizenship)
- Biodata information
- Parent/guardian information
- Biometric details
- Birth place
- Marital status
- Educational particulars
- Occupation
- Incapacity
- Agricultural land ownership

Process & where to have number taken

- An individual fills in a copy of the Huduma Namba form that will contain your bio-data, photo and biometrics,
- The clerk will use the registration device to conduct a full fingerprint enrolment.
- Capture your photo.
- Appropriate documents that include the hard copy form you filled in are then scanned.
- Acknowledgement receipt is provided for collection of number once available.



Clerks are moving around where there are crowds but also

- Companies & Embassies can request them to come on site
- Chief camps

Who should register & how long does it take to register?

- All Kenyan nationals including children over 6 years
- All foreigners in Kenya both private and Diplomats including children over 6 years
- It takes about 5-10 minutes to register and gave information captured.
- Queues can be long midday depending with area.
- once available.

NOTE

What happens to the Current Alien Cards?

Applicants are required to retain their Alien Cards as forms of identification and proof of their immigration status in Kenya.

This is because once after the new registration, the data has to be verification against information already held to make sure that the information submitted tallies with what is already recorded.
